The finish

Our protective timber coating of choice is Intergrain Ultradeck. This natural looking finish is specially formulated to be dirt and stain resistant, whilst staying true to the beautiful characteristics of the Spotted Gum. An exceptionally long lasting, water based oil; Ultradeck emits significantly less VOC's into the atmosphere than traditional decking oil based timber finishes. It's safe to use, gentle on the environment and will protect your timber furniture against the harsh Australian environment, minimising the abrasive effects caused by continuous use.



How to extend the life of your timber

To keep your timber products looking fresh, conduct a routine 12 monthly maintenance inspection. First indication of the need for recoating will be observed as patchiness or discoloration around edges. If additional maintenance coatings are required, please refer to www.intergrain.com.au

Leaching

Draffin Street Furniture use only kiln dried hardwood, with a moisture level consistent with industry standards. However, on occasion a 'leaching' of tannins from the timber can occur. Tannins can leave visible marks on concrete surfaces and it is imperative to wash this off as soon as possible. Apply an undiluted heavy duty cleaner directly onto the affected area, scrub in and let sit for 20min. Wash away with warm water and a broom.
